The George Mason Direct Admissions Program provides a pathway for select students at participating high schools to pursue a college degree at Virginia's most diverse and innovative public research university through a simplified application process.

At George Mason, you'll join a community of individuals bringing their curiosity, talents, strengths, and resilience to the task of building the future they want and deserve.

# What is the George Mason Direct Admissions Program?

This program allows George Mason to extend an offer of admission to high-achieving students before they even apply.

We believe in being a university that is accessible and inclusive, striving to take an active role in pursuing the students who will thrive on our campus.

# Who is eligible and how are students selected?

George Mason is partnering with a select number of local high schools for this program. Any student who attends one of our partner high schools and who meets set academic requirements is eligible for the program.

Partner high schools provide George Mason with the necessary information about their students. All students who meet the set academic requirements are admitted to George Mason after completing a simplified application process.

#### What are the benefits?

Students selected for this program benefit from a streamlined admissions process and application, which includes an application fee waiver and no required essays or letters of recommendation.

Participating students can submit the application stress-free knowing their spot is reserved on campus.

#### Are there any additional requirements?

Certain programs and majors may have additional requirements for admission, such as the Honors College and majors in the College of Engineering and Computing, School of Nursing, and the College of Visual and Performing Arts.

#### How does this affect financial aid?

Participating in this program does not automatically qualify you for financial aid at George Mason. You need to apply by November 1 to receive priority consideration for merit-based scholarships and must submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to apply for financial aid.

#### What is the deadline for applying?

The nonbinding early action deadline is November 1. Applying by this deadline also means you'll receive priority consideration for the Honors College.

Participating students are advised to claim this offer by February 1, the regular decision deadline. George Mason will accept students in this program after this deadline as long as space remains available in the incoming class.
